Course Description

The Certificate II in Engineering Studies aims to provide pre-employment training and pathways in the engineering, manufacturing or related industries and accommodate entry into the wider engineering industry. Specifically a graduate of this course may:

- undertake a work-based apprenticeship, traineeship or cadetship leading into a range of careers as a trades person
- enrol into Certificate III qualifications in the engineering sectors
- gain entry level employment in engineering or related industries.
